The Bridge Foundation has the anchor house as a 'bridge' to transitional living. The three bedroom, 2,500 sq. ft. sober living home is well furnished, spacious and clean, and equipped with the right structure and resources to facilitate sobriety. Live-in house managers are on-site and present daily to help to help residents learn or relearn life skills, self-care, and enforce standards that promote introspection and staying on the right course. The Bridge Foundation fosters drama-free, healthy sober environments where residents can grow in recovery.

The job seeker is required to follow up on the outcomes of job applications.
- **Job Seeker Extended:** Caymanians seeking employment who wish to have access to available jobs and training opportunities, and is requesting WORC to provide job search support. You will be contacted to commence delivery of relevant services.

Second Chances Programme: Caymanians with a prior conviction and who have served their sentence, are invited to register with WORC in order to be considered for employment opportunities with the Cayman Islands Government, through the Second Chances Programme.
